

## **Relocate Your Business**

If you are thinking about moving or expanding your business from around the corner to a new location in Knightdale or from another state or country to Knightdale, North Carolina, you have found the most up-to-date and complete resource available for doing just that. The Knightdale Chamber of Commerce tries to answer most of your questions and/or direct you to those who can answer them.

Knightdale's strongest benefit lies in its location within Wake County and in the Triangle region and its close proximity to Raleigh. Knightdale is located 6 miles east of downtown Raleigh, the state capitol and is the largest municipality in the eastern Triangle region. The town is near to major intrastate corridors connecting us to Rocky Mount and I-95 northbound, points east as well as to Raleigh, Cary, Research Triangle Park and other points west. U.S. 264 connects Knightdale to southeastern North Carolina and places like Wilson, I-95 southbound and Greenville.

Before you make a decision on any location within the corporate limits or extra-territorial jurisdiction of Knightdale the Chamber suggests contacting the Town of Knightdale directly. Start with the planning department who can answer your questions and offer you a plethora of local information related to land use, zoning, subdivision and town ordinance issues. The staff will also be able to direct you to other town departments like public works which is the authority on water, and wastewater that is available and where.

If you are looking for land and tax assessor information you can access Wake County property information through their interactive mapping system, IMAPS. From there you can see Knightdale and other Wake County parcels, property owners, topography, soil and hydrology and aerial imagery. You can also access BOOKS, the Wake County Register of Deeds online database of deed records. When you're ready to buy and need realtors, attorneys and other professionals the Knightdale Chamber membership is here to help.

If you are a larger employer, industrial developer, commercial real estate firm or consultant you will also want to refer to the resources available from the Greater Raleigh Chamber of Commerce, Wake County Economic Development and the North Carolina Department of Commerce.
